Just recently I was chatting on the phone to two friends I have known since primary school. Their lives have mirrored ours in many ways and now they are really struggling because Judy's health is failing and she is needing constant care from her husband, Philip. Judy asked how our faith helps us cope, and that question has been spinning round in my mind ever since.

The question can be answered in many ways but crucially for me it is the certainty that however out of control everything around me may be, God is still in control, and that despite all my flaws and weaknesses, God still loves me, and is able and willing to equip me and use me in working His purposes out.

The apostle John spends 4 of the 21 chapters of his gospel recounting the events at the last supper Jesus shared with his disciples on the night of his arrest, trial, and execution. Jesus spends the last few hours of his time with the disciples underlining that same message again and again. Though their world is about to fall apart it is all in God's plan, and he will keep them safe. Though they will all let him down, still he loves them, prays for them, and will strengthen them. In the midst of the turmoil he promises them Peace and the Gift of the Holy spirit, as His living presence with them to take them into the future.

John 14:15-20 and 26-27 reads as follows:-



¹⁵ "If you love me, keep my commands. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever J — ¹⁷ the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. ¹⁸ I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹ Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will realize that I am in

my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you.

the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

The disciples at the last supper had little understanding of the momentous changes and challenges that Christ's death and resurrection would bring, Still less the full power of the Holy Spirit available to them, poured out at Pentecost that saw 3,000 new believers come to faith that day alone, as a new church, worldwide in its reach, was born.

The book of Acts reveals how they responded (not always well) to all the new challenges – teaching and discipling the new converts, issues of lifestyle and leadership, fairness and equality when the new church contained both slaves and slave-owners, rich and poor, young and old, men and women from all nations and strata of society. All under the control and direction of God's Holy Spirit.

After Jesus' death the disciples went into lockdown, fearing the worst. The coming of the Spirit gave them the courage to overcome their fears and the wisdom to face a new and unprecedented situation.

As we take our first steps tentative steps out of lockdown and emerge blinking into a world where everything is suddenly full of new dangers and so much needs to change, there are questions to ask today:-

Firstly:- how does your faith help you cope? Take time to reflect on this in the coming days and open yourself to the healing, empowering presence of God.

Secondly: - What will church look like in the coming days? Pray for wisdom as we explore new ways of relating together.

Thirdly:- How can we support the victims of this pandemic, those who have lost their jobs or loved ones, and especially those in other nations who do not have the welfare state or health service to rely on.
